

INTRODUCTION

Grants for Children & Youth lists 32,497 grants of \$10,000 or more with a total value of \$3,252,334,743 made by 1,117 foundations, mostly in 2005 or 2006. It covers grants to support services and activities for infants, children and youth to age 18: neonatal care; child welfare, including adoption, foster care, and prevention of child abuse; child development; children's rights; prevention of youth violence and rehabilitation for youth offenders; pregnancy counseling and prevention programs; adolescent parent services; pediatrics and children's hospitals; and children's museums. It also includes youth development services: youth centers and clubs; adult/child matching programs; scouting organizations, and various youth development organizations (including those for community service, agriculture, business education, citizenship, and religion). It does not include grants for college scholarships or most public or private schools.

Grants for Children & Youth is one of 12 topic-oriented publications included in the Foundation Center's *Grant Guides* series (see page v for a list of titles in the series). The *Grant Guides* are derived from the Center's grants database, which includes the grants from more than 1,250 U.S. foundations annually, including the largest foundations by total giving and the top funders in every state. Many of these foundations report their grants directly to the Foundation Center by way of grant reporting forms, electronic files, newsletters, annual reports, or other grants lists. Each volume in the *Grant Guides* series provides a general overview of foundation giving in a particular field of nonprofit activity.

The grants listed in the *Grant Guides* series are also published in *The Foundation Directory Online* subscription-based service, along with profiles of the foundations making the grants.

ARRANGEMENT

Within this volume, grants are arranged alphabetically by state, then by foundation name and recipient name within each foundation listing. For each grant you will find the following information: the name, city, and location (state or foreign country) of the recipient organization; the amount awarded; the fiscal year of grant authorization (or payment); and a description of the activity funded.

Access to the grants is available through three indexes:

- ◆ an index of recipient names;
- ◆ a geographic index (arranged by recipient state or foreign country location, then recipient name); and
- ◆ an index of subject key words.

Numeric references in the indexes are to grant identification numbers, *not* page numbers.
